# **Open Enrollment Ends October 31!**




## 2026 Open Enrollment is underway and ends Oct. 31, 2025.

#### **Active & Non-Medicare Members**

All active and non-Medicare members will be automatically enrolled in the Standard PPO Plan (formerly named the Base PPO 70/30 Plan). If you would like to enroll in the Plus PPO Plan (formerly the 80/20 Plan) or if you would like to make a change to your dependents, you will need to **TAKE ACTION** during Open Enrollment.

Non-Medicare members in the Retirement Systems who remain in the Standard PPO Plan (formerly named Base PPO Plan 70/30) and are eligible, will continue to be premium free for subscriber-only coverage.






#### **Medicare Members**

For the 2026 benefit year all Medicare-eligible members **WILL REMAIN** in the plan in which you are currently enrolled UNLESS you would like to enroll in a different plan during Open Enrollment.

You need to **TAKE ACTION** during Open Enrollment if you want to be enrolled in a different plan or need to make any changes to your dependents.

## Schedule your screening for one of the most preventable cancers

Colorectal cancer is one of the most common cancers but it's also one of the most preventable, according to the American College of Gastroenterology. Screenings are helping to drop the rate of these deaths.

Polyps can take 10-15 years to turn into cancer. According to the American Cancer Society, screening can find these polyps early, so they can be removed before they have a chance to turn into cancer.



Your screening is covered as part of your plan, so why wait? Schedule your colonoscopy today.

In addition to early prevention, you can also be rewarded under the prevention items in Go365 for an in-person colonoscopy. Once the claim has been processed with Humana in the same calendar year you can call or go online to redeem rewards for gift cards. The rewardable amount for a colonoscopy is \$50 towards gift cards.

\*Must give ample amount of time for claim processing. If claim is processed in the following year, rewards cannot be issued per Medicare guidelines.

### October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month

(All Members)



**Breast Cancer Awareness Month** holds different meanings for everyone. For some, it's a season of pink ribbons and reminders of a disease that has profoundly affected their lives. For others, it's an opportunity to support the more than 2 million women worldwide diagnosed each year. For the State Health Plan, it's a time to honor survivors, support those currently battling the disease, and promote awareness about prevention and early detection.

#### **Key Facts About Breast Cancer:**

- Over 300,000 new cases are expected in 2025.
- Over 42,000 women will die from breast cancer in 2025.
- Black women are more likely to die from breast cancer than women of any other racial or ethnic group.
- About 16% of women with breast cancer are younger than 50 years of age.
- About 66% of cases are diagnosed at a localized stage, before cancer has spread outside of the breast, when treatments tend to work better
- Men can get breast cancer too, about 2,400 cases annually.
- There are about 4 million breast cancer survivors in the U.S., including those currently being treated and those who have finished treatment.

According to the CDC, breast cancer is the most common cancer among U.S. women. Mammograms are the best way to detect breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat and before it is big enough to feel or cause <u>symptoms</u>.
